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REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ Commitments decreased .29% from 8,064 in 2015 to 8,040 in 2016
- ★ MaleBookings increased .01% from 6,036 in 2015 to 6037 in 2016
- ★ Female Bookings decreased 1.2% from 2,028 in 2015 to 2,003 in 2016
- ★ Funds generated from Ordinance Charges decreased 13% from \$36,600 in 2015 to \$32,175 in 2016
- ★ The Average Daily Inmate Population increased 10% from 411 in 2015 to 453 in 2016
- ★ Inmate Releases increased 1.8% from 7,948 in 2015 to 8,093 in 2016
- ★ Inmate Meals Served increased 9.9% from 450,765 in 2015 to 495,819 in 2016
- ★ Inmate Telephone Contributions decreased 1.7% from \$175,614 in 2015 to \$172,622 in 2016
- ★ Inmate Welfare and Recreation Commissions decreased 3.7% from \$135,716 in 2015 to \$130,624 in 2016
- ★ Funds Generated by the Inmate Work Release Program decreased 28% from \$27,717 in 2015 to \$19,945 in 2016
- ★ Inmate Medical CO-Pay increased 7.8% from \$1,765 in 2015 to \$1,904 in 2016
- ★ Continued Active Accreditation from the National Commission on Correctional Health Care.

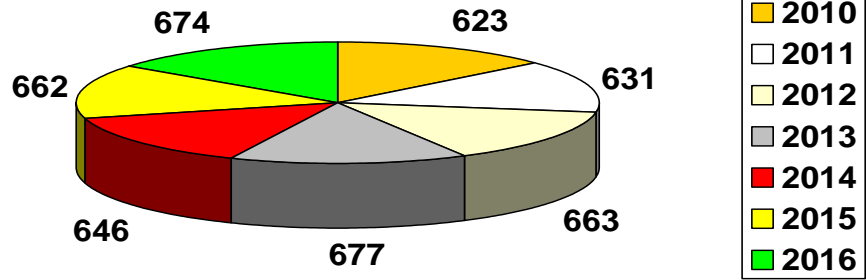

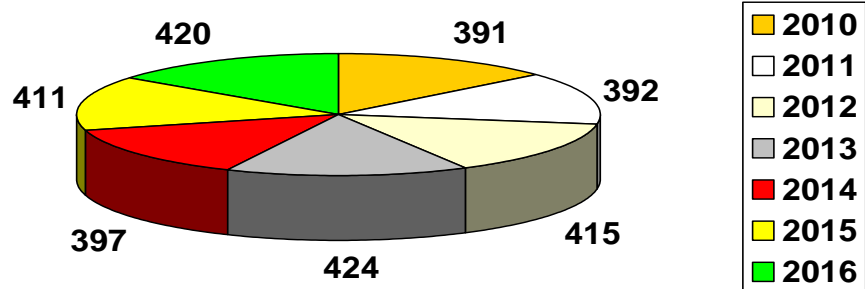
AVERAGE MONTHLY INMATE RELEASE CHART

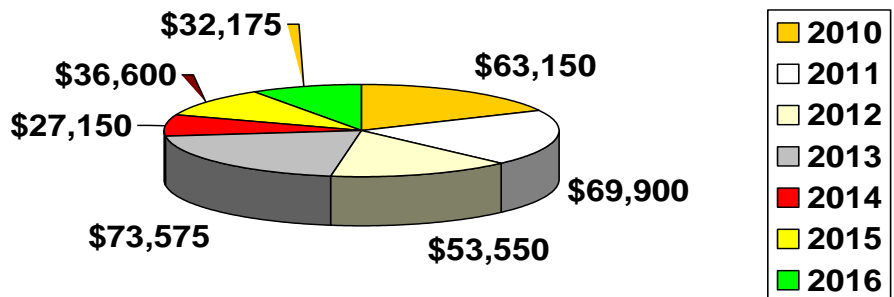

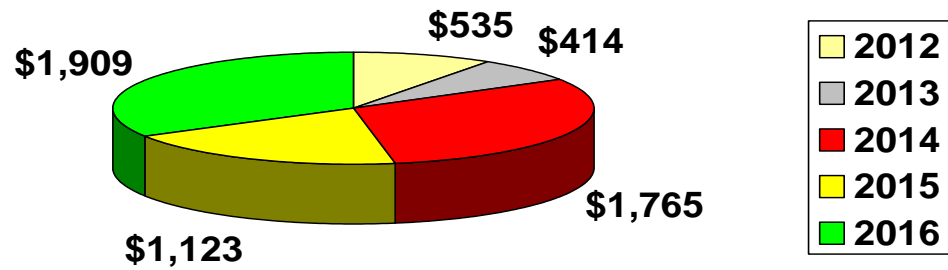

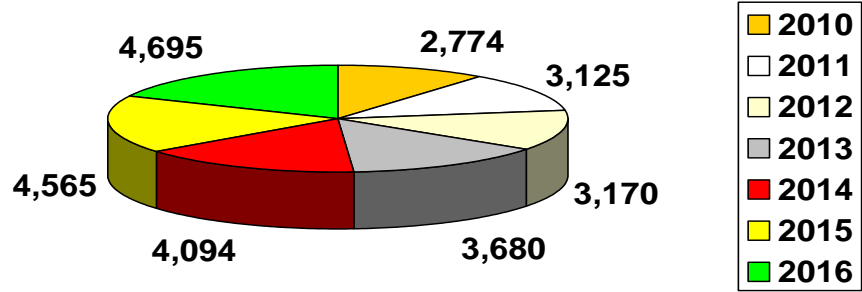

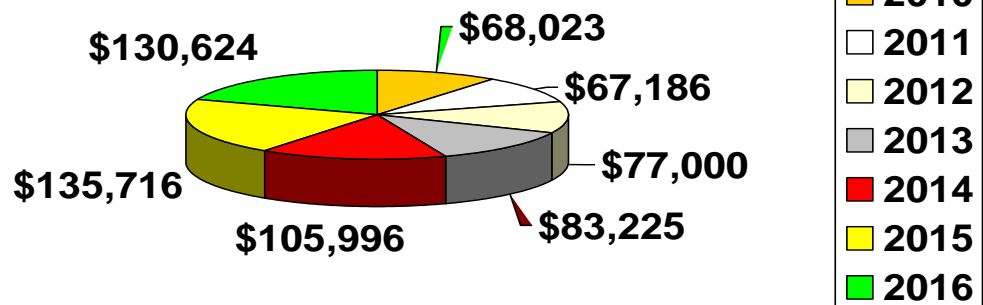
INMATE WELFARE AND RECREATION COMMISSIONS CHART

The Lorain County Sheriff's Office has contracted ARAMARK Food Services to provide commissary to the inmate population. Inmates are permitted to purchase hygiene, writing, food items and other approved products. The Sheriff's Office earns 30% commission of the total items purchased weekly.

Per the Ohio Revised Code the commissions forwarded to the Lorain County Sheriff's Office are placed into a special inmate welfare and recreational account. Expenditures from the inmate welfare and recreational account may only be allocated for items that solely and directly benefit the inmate population.

Items routinely purchased from this account include: Drug and alcohol counseling services, books and educational material, indigent, hygiene and writing items, televisions, and exercise related items.

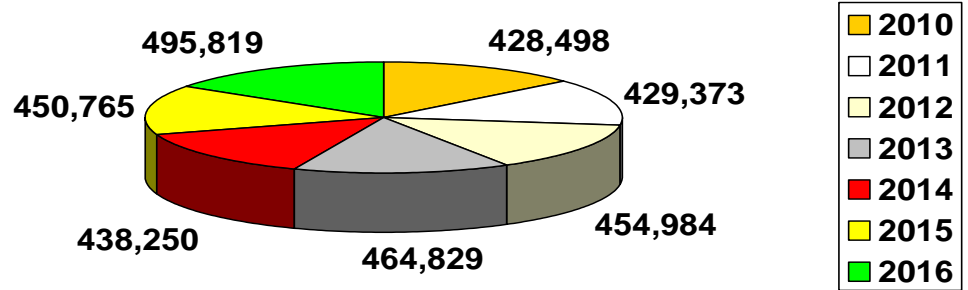


INMATE MEALS SERVED CHART

Inmates are on a 2,800 calorie a day diet. Each meal costs approximately \$1.15 per inmate.

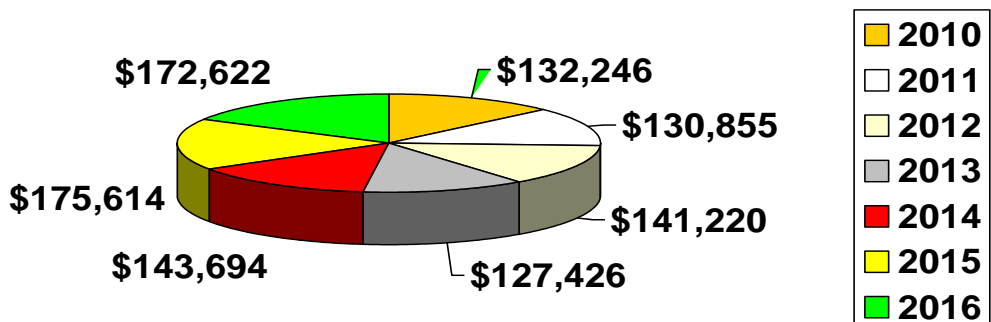

INMATE WORK RELEASE CHART

Inmates sentenced to the work release program are permitted to maintain their employment by being allowed to leave the facility for scheduled work. Inmates are randomly checked by jail staff to assure they are at their place of employment .

Inmates who are accepted into the work release program are required to pay one hours wage per day to the Lorain County Sheriff's Office to help defray the cost of their incarceration.

*Per the Ohio Revised Code any monies collected are placed into the Lorain County General Fund.
